SOUTH ROAD UPGRADE / ANZAC HIGHWAY UNDERPASS PROJECT- SITE INVESTIGATIONS ON THE FORMER BP SITE

I wish to advise you that environmental sampling of the residual soil on the former BP site will be commencing from Wednesday 15 August 2007. This sampling is being undertaken to identify any hydrocarbon impacts from the site's previous usage as a petrol station.

Associated works will include general excavation works, soil sampling and stock piling. Some additional geotechnical testing will also be conducted at the same time, in preparation for major construction works. These works are expected to be undertaken over a period of 3 to 4 weeks, at periodic times between 8am to 6pm, Monday to Saturday.

All potentially hydrocarbon impacted materials that are awaiting sample analysis will be isolated in a plastic lined bunded area on site, away from general excavated soil stockpiles. Once the sampling results have been received, the most effective way of managing the materials can be determined. Any materials that cannot be remediated on site will be safely removed in accordance with the appropriate environmental controls.

These works are not expected to cause any major disruption to local residents / businesses and pose no threat to public safety. A slight odour i.e. petrol smell, may be experienced at times when excavation and stockpiling is being undertaken, however, all activities will be closely monitored to ensure impacts to the local community are minimised.
